

## **Comment on the paper of Professor Dr. h.c. mult. Burkhard Hess**

1. This article provides a detailed report on the digitalization of court proceedings in Europe, particularly in Germany and France, from which I personally benefited greatly.
2. Regarding the publication of court rulings, I'd like to make a simple comparison between Germany and Taiwan.
3. In internet, it is possible to see that the Federal Constitutional Court and the Federal Court of Justice announce their judgments. The announcement of a judgement of the Federal Constitutional Court is a very detailed process, while, on the other hand, the presiding judges of the Federal Court of Justice usually only read out the main points of the judgment.
4. In Taiwan, after the Constitutional Court's rulings are published either orally by the Constitutional Court or only in writing, the Chief Secretary invites on the same day the media to explain the merits of the ruling and answer questions raised by the media. As for the rulings of the Supreme Court and other courts, they are only published in writing on the Judicial Yuan's website. In exceptional cases that attract public interest, the court that decides may invite media to briefly explain the main points of the ruling and answer the questions raised by the media.
